Improving access for patients

UNITY HUB

The Unity Hub is formed by a collaboration of practices within the Wolverhampton CCG including Duncan Street Surgery, Castlecroft Surgery, Mayfield Medical Centre, Probert Road surgery to name but a few. The Hub is based presently at Intra Health's primary practice of Pennfields Health Centre, Upper Zoar Street Pennfields and the aim is to improve the appointment access for the patients whose surgeries are involved with the Unity Hub. Extra evening, Bank Holiday appointments have been available since April 2018 and from August 2018 Sunday pre-bookable appointments will be available to patients, session holders will include GPs Advanced nurse practitioners, Nurses & Healthcare assistants. Appointments are bookable via the patient's own surgery. Patient consultations are recorded directly into their own medical records and referrals actioned immediately if required.

Each surgery has had funding allocated to unity, determined by the practice's patient size list. By working together with other surgeries helps practices to achieve the government's directive of a seven day service for patients.

A PPG member advised that she had used the service and was very "impressed" which is very encouraging.

Unity Utilization Figures

The number of extended hours appointments slots available from April-June 2018 was 1213 and 704 were used by patients, of which 78 appointments were booked by Parkfield Medical Practice patients.

Unity PPG chair meeting

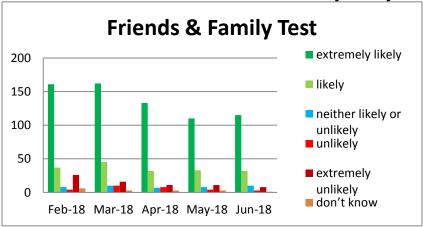
The Unity Hub has its own PPG meetings usually the chairperson or a nominated person from each practice attends. Two PPG members have offered to attend the next meeting on the 15th October 2018 to represent the practice

Care Navigation Utilisation Figures

Current services that practices can navigate to are: One you, Carers support, MECS (formerly PEARS – minor eye ailments) Minor ailment scheme and dental services. Parkfield medical staff continue to navigate patients to the appropriate services and record this transaction in the patients records. The Unity Hub will continue to extract information from the practice in order to relay feedback. It was felt that overall Care Navigation scheme was worthwhile and in some instances the patients are be seen faster elsewhere, receiving the appropriate treatment needed than booking an appointment at the surgery.

Friends and Family Test

The practice continues to collect postcard and website responses and SMS MJOG text messaging services for the Friends and Family Test. Responses for both sites Parkfield Medical Practice (PMC) and Woodcross Health Centre (WDX) are collated separately and then combined. The % figures are the percentage of positive responses (i.e. Extremely like & Likely) to the question: **How likely are you to recommend our service to friends and family if they needed similar care or treatment?**
